

Fran Snygg Grant for Artistic Collaboration

Deadline: Friday, October 31, 2008

The Fran Snygg Grant for Artistic Collaboration is to encourage artistic collaborations in conjunction with Arts Week, an annual showcase for the arts on campus and in the Bloomington area organized by the Arts Coordinating Council. Arts Week will be held February 19 through March 1, 2009. The Arts Coordinating Council will award one or two grants for collaborative arts projects that will take place or be exhibited during Arts Week 2009. The total award is \$1500.

There are two distinct funding opportunities - the Fran Snygg Grant and the Fran Snygg Endowment Fund. This announcement pertains to the Fran Snygg Grant.

To be eligible for the grant, the group of collaborators must include:

1. IU-Bloomington faculty members/students from at least two different schools or two different departments in the College of Arts and Sciences; or
2. one or more faculty members and one or more professional artists in the Bloomington area, in affiliation with a community arts organization; and
3. at least two different arts must be represented;
4. Student productions must have a faculty member.

The project may be a performance, an exhibit, or some other collaborative endeavor between artistic disciplines. The Council is especially interested in new groups, new ideas, and new collaborations, and encourages groups to consider proposing events that could take place in tandem with the opening reception for Arts Week 2009. Costs incurred in the project must be paid from the grant or from other support; there will not be separate funding to defray costs.

Proposals must include the following information:

1. A cover sheet indicating the name of the organization, names of participants, faculty member's name, address, telephone number, fax number, and e-mail; name of the event/project.
2. A description and explanation of the project, including its potential audience, feasibility, space needs, and interdisciplinary nature.
3. Budget.
4. Curriculum vitae for the participants, as appropriate.
