The European Union and Why It Matters to Indiana

a workshop for grades 6 – 12 teachers

In advance of **Europe Day**, the European Union Center of Excellence at Indiana University is organizing a workshop for teachers grades 6–12. This workshop will introduce twenty-five teachers—the same number as member countries in the EU—to the governmental institutions of the EU and to their history and relationship vis-à-vis individual member states. This will be followed by topical discussions of EU policies and why and how the EU is relevant to the state of Indiana. The afternoon session will be devoted to a **model EU** exercise, with each teacher representing a particular EU member country. Presentations will stress the interdisciplinary nature of EU studies—economics, environment, geography, globalization, government, languages and culture, etc.

Workshop attendance will be limited to the first twenty-five teachers who pre-register.

Lunch and a packet of teaching materials will be provided. **Sub pay scholarships** are available from the Indiana Department of Education.

Teachers may have the option of enrolling in **one credit hour** of continuing education course work for attendance at the workshop and completion of a follow-up curriculum unit.
